

KEEP YOUR CHARGE STRONG

BATTERY MAINTENANCE

Batteries are the most important part in your golf cart. Batteries should be carefully inspected on a regular basis in order to detect and correct potential problems before they can do harm. It is a great idea to start this routine when you first receive the batteries are first received. If you take good care of your batteries, they will last you 4-7 years on personal use. Treat battery maintenance as important as oil changes in your car.

Flooded batteries need water.

More importantly, watering must be done at the right time and in the right amount or the battery's performance and longevity suffers.

Water should always be **added after fully charging the battery**.

Prior to charging, there should be enough water to cover the plates. If the battery has been discharged (partially or fully), the water level should also be above the plates. Keeping the water at the correct level after a full charge will prevent having to worry about the water level at a different state of charge.

Depending on the local climate, charging methods, application, etc., Trojan recommends that batteries be checked once a month until you get a feel for how often your batteries are need watering.

BATTERY MAINTENANCE

Step-By-Step Watering Procedure

1. Open the vent caps and look inside the fill wells.
2. Check electrolyte level; the minimum level is at the top of the plates.
3. If necessary add just enough water to cover the plates at this time.
4. Put batteries on a complete charge before adding any additional water (refer to the Charging section).
5. Once charging is completed, open the vent caps and look inside the fill wells.
6. Add water until the electrolyte level is 1/8" below the bottom of the fill well.
7. A piece of rubber can be used safely as a dipstick to help determine this level.
8. Clean, replace, and tighten all vent caps.

Important Things to Remember

Do not let the plates get exposed to air. This will damage (corrode) the plates.
Do not fill the water level in the filling well to the cap. This most likely will cause the battery to overflow acid, consequently losing capacity and causing a corrosive mess.

Do not use water with a high mineral content. Use distilled or deionized water only

CAUTION: The electrolyte is a solution of acid and water so skin contact should be avoided.

WARNING: Never add acid to a battery.

TIRE CARE

You can optimize the life of your golf cart tires by maintaining the proper air pressure. Overinflated tires will wear faster and uneven.

Tire pressure is important for not only the safety of your cart but also for the life of your tire and for the quality of your ride.

You will find the recommended Tire Pressure, or psi (pounds per square inch), on the tire's sidewall.

TOW SWITCH

Later models of golf carts often have a Tow/Run switch that is located under the seat. Set the switch to Tow anytime you perform any maintenance on your golf cart including working on the batteries.

This switch is also used anytime the golf cart needs to be towed. The golf cart can roll freely in this position which helps to protect internal components like the electric motor and controller.

CHARGING YOUR CART

There are a few important things you need to know about charging your cart.

1. Place charger on ground or floor of cart. Never leave charger on the seat.
2. Batteries should be charged after each period of use
3. Charge only in well-ventilated area. Keep sparks or flames away from a charging battery.

WARNING !

Hydrogen gas is generated as a natural byproduct of the lead-acid battery charging process. A four percent concentration of hydrogen gas is explosive and could cause severe injury or death. Charging must take place in an area that is adequately ventilated (minimum of five air exchanges per hour).

So you want to keep your golf cart looking' pretty do ya?

Constant cleaning & upkeep on a golf cart will hold its value in the long run. Unlike a car, everything in a golf cart is exposed to the elements. Maintaining the cosmetics of the cart will keep its value and maintain its durability.

WEATHER TIPS:

Rain- please, please..do not leave your cart in the rain. Would you leave the top down in your convertible? If you do happen to leave your cart in the rain, wait till seats are dry before folding down the back seat.

Also, water spots are very real. Wipe down your cart after rain or you will be left with dots on your cart for the rest of time.

ALSO, whats worse than leaving your cart in the rain? Leaving your charger in the rain. Please do not do this either.

Sun- leaving your cart in the sun all day, everyday could significantly fade out the seats. Leaving town for a few weeks? Throw a cover on.

Heat- unfortunately if you live in a hot/humid climate, you will need new batteries sooner rather than later. I wish I had a tip for this but its just a fact.

Salty areas - AKA the beach or coastal cities. AKA where most of our carts are delivered to. Metal parts on your golf cart will be prone to rust! Clean your cart every now and then and we promise, you will be glad you did!

WHAT TO USE:


- windshield - acrylic glass cleaner
- seats - multi-surface spray / pine-sol
- body - foam spray w/microfiber towel
- black rubber/tires - no touch wet look
- wheels - no touch wheel care
- mirrors - glass cleaner



GOLF CART SAFETY & DRIVING

SAFETY

1. Never drive recklessly or joy ride. Drive courteously. Obey all vehicle traffic laws and rules of the road.
2. Never drive intoxicated or under the influence of any drug or narcotic.
3. Avoid distractions while operating the golf cart just as you would in an automobile. Be safe and attentive -- avoid talking, texting, or reading while driving, reaching for objects, applying makeup or eating.
4. Golf carts should be equipped with seat belts for driver and all passengers. The driver and all occupants should utilize available seatbelts anytime the vehicle is in use.
5. Only carry the number of passengers for which there are seats.
6. Drivers and all passengers should keep all body parts (arms, legs, feet) inside cart while vehicle is in motion, except when signaling a turn.
7. Do not allow anyone to ride standing in the vehicle or on the back platform of the vehicle. Do not put vehicle in motion until all passengers are safely seated inside vehicle.
8. Operate the vehicle from the driver's side only.
9. Use hand signals to indicate your intent to turn due to the small size and limited visibility of the turn signals on a golf cart.
10. Check blind spots before turning. When making a left hand turn, yield to the thru traffic lane and merge into that lane before turning left.
11. Carefully turn and look behind golf cart before backing up.
12. Avoid sharp turns at maximum speed, and drive straight up and down slopes to reduce the risk of passenger ejections and/or rollover. Avoid excessive speed, sudden starts, stops and fast turns.
12. Reduce speed due to driving conditions, especially hills or other inclines or declines, blind corners, intersections, pedestrians and inclement weather.
13. Do not leave keys in golf cart while unattended.
14. Always yield to pedestrians and be cognizant of motor vehicles.
15. Use extreme caution in inclement weather. Although a golf cart may shield you from the rain, it may not protect you from a lightning strike.



HOW TO OPERATE

RXV EZ-GO



Place key in ignition. (straight edge to the left) F stands for forward, N for neutral and R for reverse. Computer will not engage ignition if your feet are on the brake or accelerator. Blinkers will not turn off automatically. Make sure you turn off the turn signal after done turning. (before you look like any other old guy driving down the road) Adjust mirrors to proper view and make sure all passengers are buckled.

Lights can be turned on by twisting turn signal nob forward.

Congrats, you're ready to drive. Here are some tips:

- Take it slow on dips & bumps.
- NEVER slam on the brake. Well, probably shouldn't say never...if a car suddenly stops in front of you, slam down please. But avoid it at all costs. Abruptly stopping the brakes will wear down the motor brake and can eventually destroy it.
- Watch for people. Side mirrors are major blinders to traffic and pedestrians.

BROKEN DOWN?

Uh oh...did somebody slam down on the brake a little too hard?

It's ok...contact our repair team and we'll get you back on the road in no time.

If you were able to drive the cart home, please do not drive it until looked at by a professional.
